
Recent Activities

ROLE OF A GOVERNOR

As set out in our Code of Conduct for the Governing Body document, the governing body has the following core strategic functions:

Establishing the strategic direction by:

- o Setting the vision, values, and objectives for the school
- o Agreeing the school improvement strategy with priorities and targets
- o Meeting statutory duties

Ensuring accountability by:

- o Appointing the Headteacher
- o Monitoring progress towards targets
- o Performance managing the Headteacher
- o Engaging with stakeholders
- o Contributing to school self-evaluation

Ensuring financial probity by:

- o Setting the budget
- o Monitoring spending against the budget
- o Ensuring value for money is obtained
- o Ensuring risks to the organisation are managed

To ensure these core strategic functions are met, each individual governor has a role to play within the governing body. While the role demands a level of time and effort, the Governing Board work together as a team and all accept fair responsibility in effectively meeting our statutory duties.

As individual governors we are expected to:

- o rigorously and consistently monitor SIP targets and data to ensure progress
- o participate in events and training opportunities throughout the year
- o be a link governor for a subject area or key stage
- o ask questions to explore issues further
- o ensure we deliver the very best education possible for the children in Forton Primary School
- o seek to provide the appropriate balance of support and challenge so that the school fulfils its statutory

duties
