Discovery of Tutankhamun's Tomb - 1922

Civilisation

Empire

Sarcophagus

a sarcophagus is a stone coffin or container to hold a coffin.

Tomb

A tomb is a place where a corpse is buried.

Afterlife

An existence after death. Ancient Egyptians believed that they would go to an underworld beneath the Earth called Duat.

Mummification

The process of making a body into a mummy preparing it for the afterlife.
