Ancient Rome – 800 BC – AD 476
 Iron Age – 800 BC – AD 43
 Ancient Greece – 776 – 146 BC
 Roman Invasion of Britain (Julius Caesar) – 55 BC and 54 BC
 Emperor Claudius conquers Britain – AD 43
 AD 61 - Iceni revolt led by Boudicca

Roman Empire	The largest empire of the ancient world. The Romans ruled many countries including Great Britain.
Civilisation	A group of people with their own languages and way of life.
Invade	To enter a country or place by force with an army.
Conquer	To defeat someone or something, usually with force.
Resistance	An opposing or impeding force.
Rebellion	Opposition to one in authority or dominance.
Revolt	To rise up against an authority in act of rebellion.
Monarchy	A form of government that has a single person known as a monarch (King/Queen) as its head.
